A Letter from the CEO Reflections on the past year

In spite of the health and social crises, we rose above the fear and noise to focus on our mission in a time when entrepreneurs and small businesses needed help more than ever.

2020 Breakthroughs

In March, we quickly shifted to a virtual-first organization, not missing any scheduled programs and in fact adding many new programs to connect entrepreneurs to critical resources needed during this unprecedented time.

Our impact was greater than ever before. We doubled our participation, serving a total of 4,000 entrepreneurs. After Metro Government asked that we partner to provide services to our local entrepreneurs and small businesses, we launched Renew Nashville to help more than 800 small businesses survive the pandemic.

This work provided more than 152 office hours for business owners needing expert support and connected more than 800 business owners to a network of 350+ advisors. As we expanded offerings to more entrepreneurs than ever, we also gave them the tools to adjust to a rapidly changing world, including access to two production studios where they can produce their very own audio and video content to reach customers, marketing and e-commerce expertise as well as advertising campaigns.

With special attention to our signature programs, we expanded Project Music to Project Music & Entertainment, grew Project Healthcare by 200% with the launch of a new vertical for medical device companies and added a cohort program for companies averaging \$750K in annual revenue.

We brought the community together (virtually) to celebrate the innovators having a positive impact in our community with Pitch for Good - our most successful pitch series to date - and awarded \$28,000 in financial grants and even more in scholarships to support entrepreneurs working for good across all industries.

Support came from all directions. From our new elite speaker series that brought people like Jim McKelvey, Joe Scarlett, and Taj & Eddie George to our community to the new Phase 4 Successful Entrepreneurs Group where we onboarded more than 20 elite entrepreneurs to support our mission and saw two investment deals as a direct result.

We also celebrated our 10th Anniversary by hearing from some of the people who made the Nashville Entrepreneur Center possible like John Ingram, Janet Miller, Marcus Whitney and more, with our #Powerof10 Campaign, which took the place of our annual NEXT Awards event.

Culture of Inclusion

2020 was a year that challenged our culture. We recognize that the future of our city depends on our ability to grow successful entrepreneurs, regardless of race, gender, income or other factors. We work every day to make a positive difference in the lives of those we serve and part of that is leveling the playing field to make entrepreneurship accessible to everyone.



Reflections on the past year

While good strides have been made in this area, there's still more work to be done. We have scholarships for entrepreneurs from underrepresented backgrounds, but we would like to make more available. We have advisors, industry experts and successful entrepreneurs from diverse backgrounds who help mentor our entrepreneurs, but we would like to have more people participate in this program to make sure it reflects the full diversity of our city.

Building on 10 Years of Success

Upon joining the EC, I talked with, and more importantly listened to, hundreds of people—entrepreneurs, business leaders, investors, alumni, academics and others—to understand the original mission of this organization, the role it plays in our community today, and its purpose looking forward. I wanted to understand the needs and where this organization can truly create significant impact moving forward.

One thing became clear in this listening process: When someone takes the leap into becoming an entrepreneur, they never stop being one. Entrepreneurs are people who are wired to solve problems, to keep moving forward, to have a purpose and vision that drives decisions.


Once an entrepreneur, always an entrepreneur, whether that means actively starting business after business, or reaching back to help those who are following behind them.



Our Purpose

We are a non-profit organization that makes it easier for entrepreneurs to be more successful by providing the most powerful resources and tools possible for individuals and communities to build shared prosperity, solve problems and create a better tomorrow.

While many amazing organizations treat the symptoms of social and economic challenges (supplying food, clothes and shelter), the EC provides a means for communities to break that cycle of need by enabling successful businesses to create wealth, jobs and economic growth for the whole city.

Many who choose this route experience gaps in access to:

- · Entrepreneurial education
- Mentorship
- Funding

All are critical resources which will increase their probability of success far beyond the 50% U.S. average rate of survival.

Entrepreneurship is a mechanism for fostering community development as it creates jobs, innovation and economic mobility.

Entrepreneurial companies make up 23% of Nashville's economy. Now serving more than 2,000 entrepreneurs annually, over the past 10 years, we've helped more than:

Our Purpose

The EC meets needs across the entrepreneurial lifecycle:

We meet these needs virtually and at our location inside Nashville's historic Trolley Barns.

How do we know if we're successful?

We measure the success our program participants have in starting and growing their businesses.

Indicators vary but generally include: survival rate, funds raised, revenue generated and jobs created. We look at these metrics to measure long-term effects of our work.

Other critical metrics we track are to ensure our efficacy: % of growth milestones achieved and the NPS reported by the entrepreneurs. Qualitatively, we incorporate evaluations of the entrepreneurs from our network of experts and our internal team. The EC collects this data by directly surveying or interviewing our entrepreneurs, experts and internal team.



A Diverse Community of Innovators

Great ideas are everywhere, but the opportunity to turn those ideas into reality is not equally accessible to all.

We level the playing field by creating onramps to opportunity.

Entrepreneurship should be accessible to everyone, and we are working towards the day when every entrepreneur—regardless of race, gender, income or background—has the opportunity to realize their dream.

Why? To fuel economic inclusion in Nashville.

We believe that:

Every person with the entrepreneurial mindset and a good idea deserves a (credible) opportunity to create, launch and grow their business.

The future of our city depends on our ability to grow successful entrepreneurs, regardless of race, gender, income or zip code.

Entrepreneurship powers the spirit of independence and vibrance that makes Nashville special.





















What Our Community Looks Like

The EC community is a diverse group by gender, race, age, and sexual orientation.

We help level the playing field for all.

42% being female

36% are people of color

8% LGBTQ+









In our 10 years, more than 92 scholarships have been distributed to underrepresented founders of color, women, foreign born, veterans, LGBTQ+ and student founders who saw cost as a barrier.

The scholarship awards grew from being primarily applied to the EC's PreFlight Cohort, to scholars who participate in the entire suite of the EC's year-long accelerator level programs (InFlight, Project Music and Entertainment, Twende for Founders of Color, and Project Healthcare.)

Some of our findings are:

- Every dollar invested into a scholarship = \$7 in investment and \$4 in revenue for companies.
- Scholars have created more than 65 jobs in Middle Tennessee.
- Rates of full-time entrepreneurship doubled for scholarship program participants.

Our Scholar Program serves Middle Tennessee founders who identify as a racial or ethnic minority in the U.S., specifically Black, LatinX, Hispanic, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian American, Pacific Islander, Middle Eastern or North African.



Small Businesses

The COVID-19 pandemic drastically changed the business landscape, put immense pressures on small businesses and forced many to close.

Small business owners were unclear on where to turn for help, and small business support organizations saw unprecedented increases in demands for support. The inequities which create barriers to success for entrepreneurs and minority-owned small businesses became even more evident, so we expanded our reach to small business owners and founders, and offered our expertise, networks and experience to increase the likelihood of their survival.

Introducing Renew Nashville

To increase the survival rate for those most vulnerable to the pandemic, we launch Renew Nashville, a citywide initiative addressing the significant challenges facing entrepreneurs and small businesses. The EC was awarded a \$600,000 grant by The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County as one of Nashville's nonprofits charged with addressing the significant challenges facing entrepreneurs and small businesses negatively impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.

Collaborating with local non-profit partners across Nashville, we stepped up as the hub for entrepreneurs to provide participants access to master-class resources such as daily office hours, space, programming, and executive level advisors, such as lawyers, accountants, marketing experts. We helped with modifying websites to e-commerce solutions, video storytelling, new headshots, radio advertisements. The program was free for Davidson County businesses.

Getting the word out to all those who need us most was our main focus, especially for minority-owned businesses. Through an integrated marketing communications and stakeholder outreach strategy, we launched a campaign to rally all small businesses.

Overall, this program served more than 800 businesses ranging from hospitality, retail, consumer goods, music tech, healthcare innovation, personal and business services, to education innovations.





Originally started as Project Music in 2015, this program was developed in partnership with the CMA (Country Music Association) to bring music, technology and business leaders together to accelerate the development of industry-changing startups. We are able to make this happen thanks to our vast network of expertise, including more than 100 mentors dedicated specifically to mentoring Project Music and Entertainment entrepreneurs. In 2020, we conducted our first-ever, 100% virtual program serving music-minded entrepreneurs from across the country with weekly sessions, pitch-creation support, an investor showcase, stakeholder meetings, and more.

With the launch of the 2021 application process we also announced that the next cohort of Project Music will expand to include all aspects of the entertainment industry, including music, sports, film, esports/gaming, publishing, and more.





In 2020, we created a series of seven virtual monthly pitch events, called Pitch for Good. From the beginning, the purpose was to highlight and support Nashville's entrepreneurs focusing their innovation on solutions which benefit our community and world. For each event, two winners were chosen by a panel of expert judges to receive \$2,000 grants and one audience favorite was chosen to receive a scholarship to an EC program.

The end of the 2020 season culminated in Pitch for Good: Tennessee Tough presented by Pinnacle Bank, an event for which we partnered with the Tennessee Titans to select the "best-of-thebest" of our Pitch for Good winners. CPR Wrap founder Felicia Jackson walked away the winner of this final competition, and received a year-long sponsorship package from the Titans.





Our Strong Roots

We live in a city filled with successful entrepreneurs that made Nashville what it is today - booming in healthcare, music and entertainment and other industries. Rooted in our history, Nashville is a city of successful entrepreneurs.

From Hall of Fame recipient, Charlie Martin, to Brian Fox, we have a wealth of successful entrepreneurs that we can all learn from. This is Nashville's biggest differentiator. Talent goes where talent lives.

More than a decade ago, the Nashville Area Chamber's Partnership 2010 initiative defined our role - to connect the experienced, successful entrepreneurs with the next generation of entrepreneurs to fuel the entrepreneurial circle. The EC's founding was truly a community-wide collaboration bringing together 75 leaders of Nashville's entrepreneurial and business communities to serve on a task force to define needs and create solutions. We started with founding of a virtual resource center but with much need and much to offer, we incorporated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit moving soon to a 19,000 square-foot location.

Our 25-member Board represents successful entrepreneurs and business leaders in healthcare, real estate, music, finance, technology, strategy, education and other industries. Active ex-officio members represent community partners: Nashville Area Chamber, Nashville Healthcare Council, Nashville Technology Council, Google for Startups, Marion Ewing Kauffman Foundation and Entrepreneurs' Organization.

The EC's \$2.7M operating budget consists of 31% earned revenue from cohort tuition, membership, space rentals and event fees. Contributed revenue represents 69% from corporate partners, sponsorships, individuals and grants. Development plans include growth of our multi-year corporate partners, such as Mitsubishi and Dell for Entrepreneurs, our McWhorter Circle giving society, the launch of the EC Alumni group and a Phase 4 Successful Entrepreneurs group who bring their expertise and experience to help entrepreneurs as they navigate their own businesses--saving time, money and resources on their path to success.
